**SREP INVESTMENT PLAN FOR BANGLADESH**

## Proposed Decision

The SREP Sub-Committee, having reviewed document SREP/SC.14/6, *SREP Investment Plan for Bangladesh*,

- a) endorses the investment plan as a basis for the further development of the projects and programs foreseen in the plan and takes note of the request for USD 75 million in SREP funding.<sup>1</sup> The Sub-Committee requests the Government of Bangladesh, in the further development of the proposed projects and programs, to take into account comments made at the meeting and any additional written comments submitted by Sub-Committee members by November 27, 2015, and to respond in writing to questions raised during the meeting and in subsequent written comments;
- b) reaffirms that all allocation amounts are indicative for planning purposes and that approval of funding will be on the basis of high quality investment plans and projects;
- c) approves USD 950,000 as preparation grant for the project entitled, *Grid-Connected Renewables* (World Bank);
- d) approves USD 950,000 as preparation grant for the project entitled, *Off-Grid Solar PV* (ADB);
- e) takes note of the estimated budget of USD 428,000 for MDB project preparation and supervision services for the project entitled, *Grid-Connected Renewables* (World Bank), and approves USD 128,000 as a first tranche of funding for such services;
- f) takes note of the estimated budget of USD 428,000 for MDB project preparation and supervision services for the project entitled, *Off-Grid Solar PV: Mini-Grid* (ADB), and approves USD 214,000 as a first tranche of funding for such services; and
- g) further takes note of the estimated budget of USD 428,000 for MDB project preparation and supervision services for the project entitled, *Off-Grid Solar PV: Solar Irrigation* (ADB), and approves USD 214,000 as a first tranche of funding for such services.
